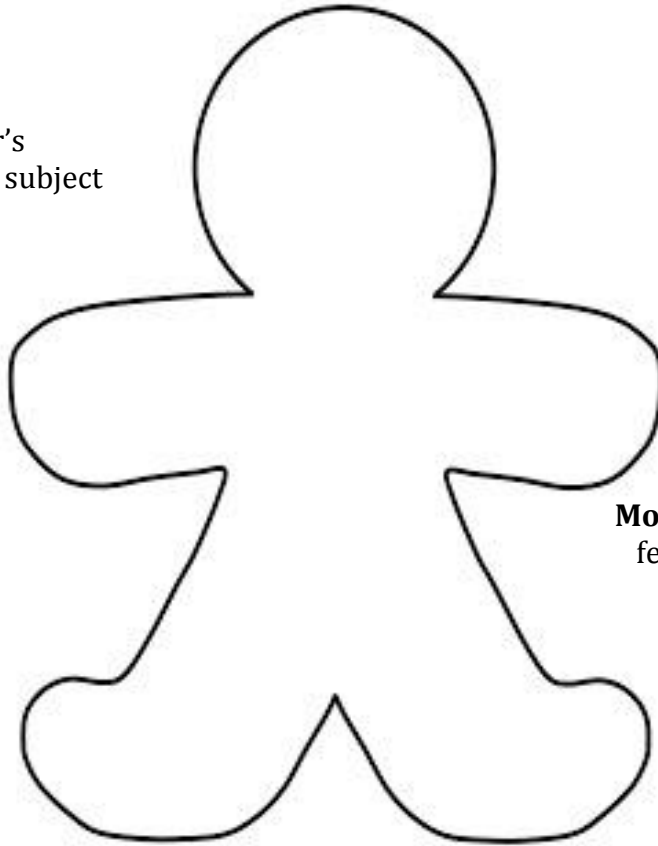

<b>moral</b>	A _____ that a story teaches. All fables have morals
<b>theme</b>	The _____ or life lesson the author is conveying to the reader. The message goes beyond the book. It applies to the world. To find the theme, first look for the _____ (friendship, growing up, judgment), and then ask, "What message is the author sending to me or the world about the topic?"  <b>Examples:</b> real friends tell the truth, growing up is not easy, don't judge people by their looks
<b>tone</b>	The author's _____ or feelings toward the subject or topic. Because you can't hear the author's voice, you have to look for word choice to help you determine the tone.  <b>Examples:</b> angry, sarcastic, passive, humorous
<b>Mood E</b>	How the audience (you, the reader) _____ when reading the text Remember "M" in mood and "M" in me. To determine the mood, ask yourself, "How does reading this make me feel?"  <b>Examples:</b> anxious, scared, angry, sad, melancholic, lugubrious
<b>Symbol</b>	An object that represents something completely different  <b>Example:</b> a heart represent love
<b>foreshadow</b>	Clues to events that occur _____ in the story
<b>flashback</b>	When a story is interrupted and _____ to an event that has occurred earlier in the story
